RT 2016 Convention Recap: A Girls' Night



Even if you haven't read the rest of the Pink Carnation books, Lauren Willig's series closer, *The Lure of the Moonflower*, will still entertain. If you're a lover of spy novels and historicals this book needs to be on your To Read list. Jane and her spy network make for a delightful little family where espionage is as common as deciding what's for dinner. The romance between Jane and Jack is a nice meeting of equals. It's great to read a historical where the hero is willing to let the heroine take charge, especially when the danger to both of them is so great. The frame tale of Colin and Eloise and a little premarriage kidnapping is equally delightful. This book stands on it's own, but be warned: once you're read it you're going to want to read them all. — *Sarah McDaniel Dyer*

It should be noted upfront that Lauren Willig's *The Lure of the Moonflower* is the 12th and final book in her Pink Carnation

series. That said, I read this book without having read the others in the series, and I adored it. Willig's book is split between two stories: that of Jane, aka the Pink Carnation, set in 1807, and Eloise, the modern-day writer who's been researching the spies in the League of the Pink Carnation. Eloise's story is much less the focus, but adds some fun modern adventures and a cute secondary love story. The real highlight, of course, is the story of the Pink Carnation. Jane is a wildly independent, adventurous and brilliant young woman, and it's such a thrill to see her kicking butt and taking names. More than that, though, is the joy I got from her love story. Her relationship with Jack feels very organic, and though they both have a hard time switching off their natural spy suspicions and letting down their guards, when they finally start to see each other as more than untrustworthy spies, their relationship is super sweet and charming. It's truly a superb read, and I can't wait to read the rest of the series. — Jennifer Peters

Willig's series has been a treat from the very first, and that she's still got it twelve books in is a feat in and of itself! What I love particuarly about this series is the voices of the protagonists, on display wonderfully here in *The Lure of the Moonflower*. The modern plotline, led by estwhile heroine Eloise, is a treat for those of us who yearn for the chick-lit boom days of yore. I would totally hang out with Eloise and get coffee — or cocktails. Jane, meanwhile, the historical heroine of the piece, is also pitch perfect, and getting to read about both women in one very well-written book is a treat indeed. Get to it! — *Elissa Petruzzi*






