



However, Camille Eide introduces the plot point with such sensitivity and respect that it's easy to identify with the characters. I cannot tell you how much I loved reading about an educated, unmarried woman making her own way in the 1950s. In a time where women were expected to stay home, marry and take care of the household, our heroine Eliza is committed to her career and correcting social injustice. Her intelligence, sensitivity and grace immediately endear her to her new boss, the famous Hollywood heartthrob Johnny Devine (whom I pictured as George Clooney... you'll see what I mean when you read). The most intriguing (and also disturbing) thing about this story is that despite the 1950s setting, the need for gender and racial equality as well as the ongoing witch hunt that is the Red Scare are very relevant today, in 2015, and I applaud Eide for being a part of the conversation. She has managed to intertwine a beautiful love story, the desire to build a personal relationship with God and the necessity for social change into one truly fantastic

I didn't know what to expect when I started *The Memoir of Johnny Devine*. But from the very first page, Camille Eide swept me off my feet and straight into 1950s Hollywood. The McCarthy-era Red Scare came to vivid life, as did the mid-century struggle for racial and gender equality. More importantly, though, the characters came to fully realized, fleshed-out, three-dimensional life. Eliza, a writer in her early 30s, is bold and brave while still feeling vulnerable and sensitive, and John is one of the warmest, most heartbreaking characters. The relationship that forms between the two of them is so very needed and welcome, and reading their story left me feeling warm and fuzzy. But one of the real standouts for me was Millie. John's elderly housekeeper, Millie is a kind, compassionate and totally unique character. She at once falls into the wise-old-housekeeper stereotype while somehow also defying convention and becoming so much more than the trope she was created to fit. I fell as much in love with her as I did John and Eliza, and I wish the book had had another hundred pages so I could spend more time with all three of them. — *Jennifer Peters*

One of the best things about having to read books to select a Seal of Excellence title each month is all of the surprises that await. You get to read from a host of pre-selected, excellent books that you might normally never pick up. And such is the case with *Johnny Devine*. 





The Spinster's Guide to Scandalous Behavior by Jennifer McQuiston

I was totally unprepared for just how delightful *The Spinster's Guide to Scandalous Behavior* would be. Peppered with entries from the diary of Edith Lucille Westmore, our heroine's deceased aunt, *Spinster's Guide* is effortlessly charming. Thomas, Lord Branston, is so refreshing — he's willing to give the very high-spirited and fiercely independent Lucy her space yet he remains a strong, sexy and steadfast hero. Even better, he's an intellectual man of science, which sent this nerd swooning. For her part, Lucy is a tough, tomboyish heroine — I loved following her journey from committed yet naive spinster to a mature woman ready to accept love. This is the first time I've read McQuiston, but she's absolutely going on my auto-buy list! — *Regina Small*



What would you do if your entire life suddenly turned upside-down? That's the question in *Secret Sisters* by Jayne Ann Krentz. If you're Madeline, you rely on your personal bodyguard, Jack, as well as your childhood best friend, Daphne, to help you figure out the answers to all the problems suddenly plaguing you — and you do it all while falling in love and rekindling an old friendship. I spent most of this book wondering what the truth might be, until I finally turned the page and got my "ah-ha" moment of revelation. It was a fun, fast-paced story that kept me guessing, and the romance was mixed in perfectly, without overwhelming the important friendship and mystery elements. Fans of romantic suspense will definitely appreciate this one. — *Jennifer Peters*


