


If Colleen Hoover's *November 9* sounds a lot like *One Day* to you, as it did to me, you'll be happy to know that you're wrong. What it is instead is the most brilliant love story, one so original and heartbreaking that you'll devour it in one sitting, as I did. Even the moments that feel like classic romance tropes are exceptional, with the characters — fans of romance novels themselves — pointing out their issues with "insta-love" and the like, and doing their best to avoid such pitfalls in their own story. Fallon is the kind of heroine you want to be BFFs with, and Ben, even at his worst, is the guy you can see falling head-over-heels for. Hoover is sure to win

a legion of new fans with this one — and I'll be first to join her fan club. — Jennifer Peters

November 9 is amazing for so many reasons. I completely devoured the book. Despite the fact that we only see the characters for one day each year, the story is rich, full of detail and completely addictive. Ben sparks an instant connection with Fallon and his deep sense of caring helps her to find strength that she no longer knew she possessed. Their love is so intense and so deep; it was often tempting to yell at them to give it up with the one-visit-a-year agreement. Smitten with each other (don't call it insta-love!), these two agree to meet up on every November 9th for five years. But the course of true love — and reading about true love — doesn't run smoothly, as Hoover weaves in some shocking plot twists that feel true to both character and narrative even as they jolted *this* reader out of her chair. 


SEEK AND FIND by Dana Mentink

I'm usually not a fan of Westerns, so when my co-worker told me I was going to love Lila Bowen's *Wake of Vultures* I was a little skeptical. But around the time protagonist Nettie Lonesome stumbled upon a hive of pseudo-hooker vampires I was, well ... hooked. Once this tale has its claws in you, it's impossible to put down. This is a coming-of-age tale for people who never felt like they belonged. Nettie is a gender queer person of color trying to find her place in a world that tells her everything she is is wrong, and it's rare to find a book where those issues alone would not become the focus. Bowen — AKA paranormal romance author Delilah S. Dawson — weaves intersectionality and the disturbing paranormal into every page. It gives a voice to characters, like Native Americans, who are usually stuck on the sidelines. If you're looking for a fantastic fantasy you need to pick up this book. — *Sarah McDaniel Dyer*






